GOAL Scholarship Program Tuition Assistance Process

We are partnered with the Georgia GOAL Scholarship Program, which assists us in providing tuition scholarships to eligible students desiring to attend our school.

This program was enacted by our state lawmakers to allow parents with a demonstrated financial need the opportunity to choose a private K-12 school for their children.

K Eligibility Requirements:

Once a student has met the admission requirements of our school, they may be considered for receipt of a GOAL Scholarship, if they meet all eligibility requirements per Georgia law, as detailed below:

- For students in grades 2 and above, a student must be a Georgia resident who is currently enrolled in, and has attended a Georgia secondary or primary public school for at least 6 weeks*
- For students in grades I and younger, a student must be a Georgia resident.
- Families of eligible students must have a demonstrated financial need.

*The six week attendance requirement may be waived in the following cases:

1. A student is or would be assigned to a public school that the Office of Student Achievement determines to be a low-performing school based on the school attendance zone of his or her primary residence, or

2. A student is the subject of officially documented cases of school based physical violence or student related verbal abuse threatening physical harm, or

3. A student was enrolled in an official home study program for at least one year immediately prior to receiving a scholarship or tuition grant under this law.

<u> Process Requirements:</u>

In order to receive a GOAL Scholarship, a student must meet all admission requirements of our school and must go through our school's financial aid application process, which includes the following:

1. Complete a financial aid application, including the submission of pages 1 and 2 of your family's most recently filed federal income tax return.

2. And/or – Complete the financial aid application of our 3rd party financial aid assessment organization.

3. Submit proof of your child's eligibility to receive a GOAL Scholarship, such as their most recent public school report card (students in grades 2 and above) or a birth certificate (students in grade 1 or younger).

Our school determines the scholarship award amount to submit to GOAL for approval, based upon the financial situation of each family and the availability of funds in our school's GOAL scholarship account.
